**ORDINANCE 18-10**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF BOONTON, COUNTY OF MORRIS, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CERTAIN PORTIONS OF THE TOWN CODE REGARDING FEES FOR PUBLIC RECORDS**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND** the Code of the Town of Boonton, Chapter 130 thereof, entitled Fees, to change the fees for Police reports.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Boonton as follows:

**Section 1.** Section 130-1 of Chapter 130, Fees, Article 1, General Provisions, Section 130-1, Fees established, Subsection (A), Government Records, of the Revised General Ordinances of the Town of Boonton is hereby amended to read as follows:

§ 130-1 Fees established

- 2) Police Reports, related documents (including discovery and insurance requests) and photographs.
  - (a) If requested and picked up in person: \$0.05 per page, starting with the first page.
  - (b) Police accident reports, when copies are requested other than in person: \$0.05 per page, starting with the first page and \$5.00 to be added to cover the administrative and mailing costs of the report.
  - (c) Photographs. Copies of color photographs under eight-by-ten inches: \$2 per page; photographs larger than eight-by-ten: \$7.50; provided, however, that were a photostatic copy is required, then in that event, the charge will be in accordance with Subsection (a) above.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

The foregoing ordinance having been introduced and passed on first reading by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Boonton, County of Morris, State of New Jersey, on November 15, 2010 and then ordered to be published according to law will be further considered for final passage and adoption at a public hearing to be held at a meeting beginning at 7:30 p.m. on December 6, 2010 at the Town Hall, 100 Washington Street, Boonton, New Jersey, when and where, or at such time and place to which said meeting may be adjourned. All persons interested will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning said ordinance.
