April 2023

- 3 4:00 PM, Police Dispatch
Person #1 –
Police found 2 dogs RAL and brought to headquarters. Responded to headquarters where the owner was on the phone looking for his dogs. Owner is Person #1, who indicated he does not know how the dogs got out. I issued two summonses for RAL.
- 4 12:00 PM, follow up from 2/6
Person #1 –
Person #1 was issued a second summons for unlicensed dog.
- 1:00 PM, Police Dispatch
Person #1 -
Person #1 reports a pregnant outdoor feral cat has been bleeding for the past several days. I responded but could not find the cat. Person #1 feeds this cat and lets it in her house. I asked her if she could put it in a carrier in her house and she said yes. She also has a 1 year old cat in her house that goes out, and is from a prior litter of the same pregnant cat. She also informed me of another sibling that is outdoors and has bite wounds, that she also lets in. I left her two carriers and she agreed to put the 3 cats in them that night and I would pick them up tomorrow.
- 5 8:00 AM, from 1 PM yesterday
Person #1 contacted me to let me know she had the three cats in the carriers. I picked them up and took them to RAH. Pregnant cat was checked out and was ok. The cat with the bite wounds was infected, and would receive treatment. The third was ok.
- 8 Avalon
I conducted a survey of animals at Avalon Boonton and found there were **98** unlicensed dogs and cats. Letters went out on 4/10 notifying those people they have 3 weeks to license their animals or receive a summons.

- 12 3:00 pm
Person brought a baby rabbit they found to the HD office. I picked it up and took to RAH.
- 19 4.45 PM, Police Dispatch
Police found a dog RAL at 300 Reservoir Drive. Dog had license tag #340, and was returned to the owner at 246 Reservoir Drive.
- 20 3:30 PM, email from Code Enforcement
Person #1 –
Person #1 has two unlicensed dogs at that address. I gave her until the end of the month to license them, or receive two summonses. Both dogs were subsequently licensed.
- 24 2:00 PM, emailed dog bite report to HD
Person #1 –
Person #2 –
Licensed dog Huck unintentionally bit Person #2 during a play session in the backyard on 4/22. It was actually a scratch on the right thumb. Person #1 took Person #2 to a quick med which treated the injury. The dog was placed on a 10 day bite quarantine.
- 26 2:30 PM, email to Animal Control
Person #1 –
Person #1 reports a small white dog tried to bite his leg as he rode his bike near his home. He also indicated the dog has gone after other people in the neighborhood. I checked our license database, but it does not show anything likely to be this dog. I asked Person #1 to try and watch where the dog goes if it happens again.
- 28 2:00 PM, call from HD
A report of a fawn in the road on Vreeland Ave near the Fireman's Home. Responded but did not see it.
