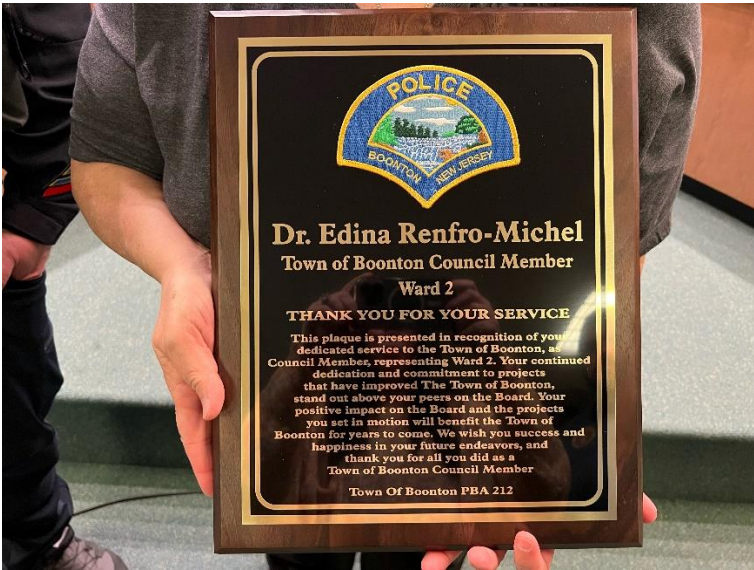

Health/Administration	<p><i>Neil Henry reported that the Town has now shifted over to the Township of Pequannock for Health Services. He is working with them to get a monthly report and hopes one will be made for the next general meeting.</i></p> <p><i>Mr. Henry also reported that cyber security training is required by the Morris County Joint Insurance Fund for all employees and government officials.</i></p>
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	<p><i>The SDL software reports have been submitted to the town council and he hopes they review them.</i></p> <p><i>He has met with Samantha Anello, Mott MacDonald Town Engineer regarding road paving.</i></p> <p><i>He continues to work with the new labor union, Council 6, and contract negotiations should begin shortly.</i></p> <p><i>Regarding the geophysical study for a proposed parking structure, the RVRSA has notified him that they have a trunk line in the vicinity and if it's needed to be moved, the Town would be responsible. They also have a lot of equipment in that area as well.</i></p> <p><i>Verizon-FIOS installation: He is still holding up road opening permits until the town is satisfied that residents are aware of their work. They have not responded to the town.</i></p> <p><i>The Town Clean-Up day is Saturday beginning at 10:00 a.m. Tree seedlings will be given away at Grace Lord Parking.</i></p> <p><i>He has heard from Congresswoman Mike Sherrill that recent grant applications for various projects have been denied. There were four grants: 1-Funding improvements at the well field, 2-Senior Bus, 3-Recreational Facility and 4-Sewer utility at Roessler Street. He indicated this is the second time the town has requested grants for the well field.</i></p> <p><i>Mr. Henry announced that the Town is in receipt of a \$65,000 grant for the Recreation Fund for a pickle ball court.</i></p> <p><i>Regarding the Arch Bridge grant, that location needs to be registered on the national historic register and more information is needed from our historic architect, Margaret Hickey.</i></p>

LINDSAY AS A TEMPORARY APPOINTMENT FOR THE POSITION OF A PROBATIONARY MUNICIPAL POLICE OFFICER, CONTINGENT UPON HIS SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF A MEDICAL EVALUATION, PSYCHOLOGICAL EXAMINATION, PHYSICAL FITNESS EXAMINATION, AND HIS APPROVAL AS A TEMPORARY APPOINTMENT BY THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION AND HIS ACCEPTANCE BY THE POLICE TRAINING COMMISSION FOR A WAIVER OF TRAINING FROM A BASIC COURSE FOR CLASS TWO SPECIAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO THE BASIC COURSE FOR POLICE OFFICERS.

WHEREAS, Kyle J. Lindsay is employed by the Town of Boonton Police Department as a Class Two Special Officer, has completed the twelve-week field training and evaluation program and is already assigned to the patrol division; and

WHEREAS, Kyle J. Lindsay will need to complete the Police Training Commission (PTC) waiver program from the Basic Course for Class Two Special Law Enforcement Officers to a Basic Course for Police Officers Certification according to the New Jersey Police Training Commission (PTC) curriculum at an approved Training Academy within the time frame established by the civil service commission under N.J.S.A 11A:4-1.3; and

WHEREAS, the Public Safety Director and the Police Department’s Officer in Charge have recommended that Kyle J. Lindsay be appointed as a Temporary Appointment for Municipal Police Officer in the Town of Boonton Police Department in accordance with N.J.S.A 11A:4-1.3, following an extensive and complete background investigation; and

WHEREAS, this appointment complies with all applicable State and Federal laws governing Equal Employment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A 11A:4-1.3 this governing body has adopted by ordinance a conflict of interest and nepotism policy and this applicant is in compliance with this statute;

WHEREAS, Kyle J. Lindsay would need to be appointed by the Town of Boonton by Resolution for Temporary Appointment for Municipal Police Officer in order to full fill his obligations for the Police Training Commission’s Basic Police Certification;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Boonton, New Jersey, that Kyle J. Lindsay be and is hereby appointed to the position of Temporary Appointment for the position of Municipal Police Officer in the Town of Boonton Police Department to be effective on the 18th of April 2023 and that he will be paid according to Step 1 of the collective bargaining agreement between the Town of Boonton and Boonton PBA Local #212.

Thereinafter, upon Kyle J., Lindsay’s successful completion of the Police Training Commission’s curriculum for the Basic Course for Police Officers at an approved training academy and with a certificate of training, he will become a probationary municipal police officer for the Town of Boonton.
