NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Boonton, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, that the Town of Boonton:

Shall accept with thanks the generous donation to the Town of Boonton by the Township of Parsippany-Troy Hills, and enter and adopt this resolution as a matter of record in accord with the above noted statutes, take title to the boat, and advise the Town's Risk Manager to place it on the Town of Boonton's list of insured vehicles.
