For new residents with pets currently licensed in another NJ municipality, there is only a \$1.00 Transfer Fee.

CHECK: Payable: 'Town of Boonton' – **By Mail:** to address above, **Drop-off:** in the 'American Flag' mailbox outside the front doors of Town Hall, **In-person:** at the Health Department in Town Hall Mon-Fri 8:30am-4:00pm.

CASH: **In-person:**(exact change) at the Health Department in Town Hall Mon-Fri8:30am-4:00pm.

Rules & Regulations:

- New residents or new pets of existing residents, must be licensed within 10 days of residing in town or within 10 days of reaching the licensing age of 7mos; a valid rabies vaccination is required to receive a license
- Licenses expire on June 30th regardless of when they were issued
- Notify the town if the cat's residence changes (in/out of town) or if the cat passes away 973.402.9410 ext 631
- Licenses must be issued to an adult member of the household; it is their responsibility to renew each year
- Cats must have their license tag affixed to a collar and never permitted to run at large

*Failure to follow the above may result in a fine, court summons and/or court appearance.
